Title VI Committee Members

- (Robert) Morning enrichment program at Frank run by Pascua Yaqui twice a week. Is there a way to make parents more aware about this? Where does the funding come from? Program is Tues/Thurs mornings 7:30-8:30 (25 student cap since teacher is alone). The program is the Pascua Yaqui language program.
- Ron discusses that Title VI funding pays for Felipa Espuma to run this program. He hopes she will continue this program next spring as well.
- Roxanne wants to know how the parents can keep in touch better. Idea: rep at every school to gather information from program and be the point of contact at each school. She wants to know what's going on at other schools and not just her son's. Is there anything she can do (a project/event)? How do we keep parents involved? **"Parent Involvement Committee"**
- Manuel would motion to approve this but understands that it is hard to make time with all of the different schedules, as well as finding a place to gather (TD3 campus or not).
- Ron says he would be the contact person for weekends if the parents want to meet at Bustoz.
- Roxanne motions to create a parent involvement committee and Manuel seconds. **Motion is passed by majority vote.**

Results of Needs Assessment / Parent Activity

- Biggest concerns/needs:
 - Math/Reading/Writing
 - Every parent wanted their children to become more aware of their heritage
 - Culture clubs and tutoring were the two most chosen options
- Ron wants the parents to know that the funding amount has not been allocated. When the funding comes, JOM Committee can gather and make decisions about how it will be best spent.
- Roxanne described asking the program to post the survey weekly until it expired but was told it was too much. Recommended that the agenda gets posted before the meeting. Discussions about how best to share information began.
- Ron said by-laws state to share with the committee before the meeting, but can change if Chairperson would like with agreement.
- Roxanne motions to send the agenda out before the meeting (Facebook, N.A.P. website, remind, etc.) and Manuel seconds. Roxanne is assigned by Chairperson to build a contact list for the parent run "Parent Involvement Committee." She will help share Native American Program information.

Parent Cultural Awareness Workshops

Math Strategies Classes - Sonja Long and Mia Valenzuela-Ponce

- 6 sessions of math strategies workshops during the evenings. All dates and times are tentative as well as locations. We want to make it as parent friendly as possible. **Maybe share the tentative dates/times (5:30-6:30 same as Pascua Yaqui run classes)/locations and find out what would be best for parents**
- Mia discussed her time at Bustoz and how those parent strategy classes/workshops worked; Foundational skills including math sense were gained.
- It's clear that the students need support, and it's also clear that parents need the knowledge of the best ways to support their children which we can offer. (workshops will support K-8)

- Roxanne asked how this would work for Montessori –Manuel said the ideals in his experience are the same (his child attended a Montessori preschool). Mia explained the handout and conceptual learning is taking place.
